


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
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Member countries 2012-13




Dementia worldwide

What's the same?

- More women than men affected.
- Families are the caregivers.
- Gap between prevalence and diagnosis
- Diagnosis late in disease process
- Co-morbid chronic diseases
- Lack of attention to population health and risk issues

What's different?

- Culture
- Access to resources
- Gender and social/economic development impact

- Specific cultural interpretations of dementia
 - Quebec
 - Africa
 - Hispanic/Latino
- Culture defined roles
 - Esp. caregiving
 - Japanese descent Americans deal with stress

Tools for cultural differences

First level language assistance

Risk reduction

 Avoid Assessment tools with a known cultural bias

Is an "early stage AD culture" developing?

- Self-advocacy and network building
- Adopting "evidence informed" (or less) health practices
- Living well with dementia (Scotland, UK)
- Alzheimer friendly communities (Belgium)
- Promotion of programs to meet unique needs
- Clash with paternal/maternalistic caregiver culture
- Redefine dementia in rights terms
